Description

Activity #1: FBLA Leadership

Be an active leader in FBLA. Do you serve as local chapter officer? Section officer? State? National Council?

- Describe the group you lead and why you choose to lead
- Describe how you have impacted the members you are leading
- Describe how your group has benefited from your leadership

Include a picture of you leading a group meeting (virtual or in person), evidence of your membership (i.e.: membership card or adviser verification) and a one-page writeup answering the questions above.

Activity #2: Supply Drive

Organize a supply drive (food, clothing, masks, hygiene products) and donate items to a local non-profit organization.

- What role did you take on to host the supply drive?
- How long did the drive run for and how much was donated?
- How does donating support the community?

Include pictures of you donating the items and a one-page write-up answering the questions above.

Activity #3: FBLA Presentation

Give a presentation about the FBLA organization to a local service group or business to gain support for your local chapter.

- How did you become acquainted with the service group?
- Get feedback and response from chosen service group about your presentation.
- What is your plan of action for service group to support your local chapter?

Submit a photo of you presenting and a one-page write-up answering the questions above.

Activity #4: New Chapter FBLA Meeting

Host a meeting (virtual or in-person) with students from a local middle school or high school in your community that does not currently have an FBLA chapter and provide information on our organization and how to start a chapter.

- What school did you select and how did you select the school?
- Get feedback and response from chosen school group about your presentation.
- What is your plan of action to support this school group in establishing a local chapter?

Include a picture of the meeting and a one-page write-up answering the questions above.

Activity #5: Meet with Officials

Meet with school administrators, local school board members or elected city officials to discuss concerns in your community and how your local FBLA chapter can be a positive resource to address these concerns.

- Create an agenda of the meeting to discuss the points of concern
- After the meeting, what are your next steps in addressing these concerns?

Include picture of you with the people you met, a copy of the meeting minutes, and a one-page write-up answering the question.

Activity #6: Extracurricular Involvement

Be an active member of a non-FBLA leadership group, or commission in your local community (i.e.: Associated Student Body, Key Club, JSA, City Youth commission, etc.).

- Describe the group you lead and why you choose to lead
- Describe how you have impacted the members you are leading
- Describe how your group has benefited from your leadership

Include a picture of you leading a group meeting (virtual or in person), evidence of your membership (i.e.: membership card or adviser verification) and a one-page writeup answering the questions above.

Activity #7: Service Video

Make a video on the importance of serving others in your community through FBLA and show it to your local chapter. Provide specific examples of how members can serve. Discuss ways FBLA can implement other means of service within the organization.
