To complete this project, ONE OPTION out of the four activities from below must be completed along with the required evidence. When submitting the project, please identify each completed option and which activity it is from.

ACTIVITY #1: Research	Complete ONE option out of the three provided to complete Activity #1.
	 Option #1: Invite an activist or a representative from an organization promoting green initiatives for sustainable company practices, to talk virtually or in person to your local chapter. Upload a photo of the meeting as proof.
	 Option #2: Complete an in-person or virtual business tour of a company dedicated to solving environmental issues, or a business with sustainable practices. Upload a photo of the tour as proof. Include a description of the company and why it was chosen.

Option #3: Research sustainable practices and how different companies help the world/their motivations to. For this option, choose one of the following methods of completion:

- Share how these practices could be implemented in your chapter in a meeting
 - Upload a photo of the meeting as proof, as well as meeting slides/materials.
- OR draft a letter to a business pitching your findings as well as an idea for a more sustainable business model.
 Upload the draft of the letter.

Complete ONE option out of the three provided to complete Activity #2.

Option #1: Create an awareness campaign emphasizing sustainability (Example topics: climate change, pollution, other environmental issues, encouraging practices like recycling, etc.).

• Upload photos of campaign materials (ex: social media posts, flyers, graphics) or of activities/events.

Option #2: Organize an online OR offline petition **OR** present at a city council/school board meeting advocating for greener policies in the local community (Example policies: composting systems, more recycling bins, energyefficient lighting, or reduced plastic use).

• Upload proof of petition (photos, signature sheet) or proof/photos of the council/board meeting.

Option #3: Host an educational meeting/workshop where members participate in environmental activities (ex: finding carbon footprints, reviewing/coming up with sustainable products/practices).

• Upload a photo of the meeting as proof, as well as meeting slides/materials.

Option #1: Organize a chapter environmental sustainability event. (Example events: Beach/Park Cleaning, Tree Planting, Community Garden, etc.) **Tip: Make this a part of the Champion Chapter Community Service Event!**

• Upload a photo of the event as proof.

Option #2: Organize a chapter community service event. (Example events: E-Waste Event, Compost Bin, Needs Drive, etc.) **Tip: Make this a part of the Champion Chapter Community Service Event! The needs drive is also a Champion Chapter task.)**

• Upload a photo of the event as proof.

Option #3: Collaborate with another community service or environmental club in the school to assist with their event.
