ACTIVITY #3: FBLA Presentation	 Give a presentation about the FBLA organization to a local service group or business to gain support for your local chapter. Get feedback and responses from chosen service group about your presentation. How did you become acquainted with the service group? What is your plan of action for the service group to support your local chapter? Requirements for submission: A photo of you presenting A report of the feedback you received from the group A one-page write-up answering the two questions listed above
